Purpose

Department for Education's Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium: "ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport."

Our Vision

At Sandhill Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE and sports to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the behaviour, concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. We want to build resilience in our children so that they do not fear failure; competitive play will allow them to develop skills that can be utilised in all areas of the classroom.

What is the Sports Premium?

The funding is jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The DfE has advised possible uses of the funding to include:

- ✓ Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
 - ✓ New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
 - ✓ Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- ✓ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
 - ✓ Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- ✓ Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
 - ✓ Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

Utilisation of the Funding by the school for the academic year 2020-21, we received funding of £18,070 This money is to be contributed to the ongoing initiatives from previous years which have proved very successful:
