Understanding School Terminology.

On a recent letter that was sent out with dates for Christmas events, I used some terminology that some parents did not understand. I apologise for this; when you are working in a school-based environment, you sometimes forget that not everybody knows this language.

The following table explains what this terminology means and which classes they are describing:

Terminology	What It Means	Classes
EYFS	Early Years Foundation Stage	Carle (Nursery) Waddell (Reception)
KS1	Key Stage 1	Donaldson (Year 1) Tomlinson (Year 2)
LKS2	Lower Key Stage 2	Seuss (Year 3/4) Dahl (Year 4)
UKS2	Upper Key Stage 2	Rowling (Year 5) Morpurgo (Year 6)

Movember (Thursday 30th November)

Assessment Weeks

We know that this can be a stressful time for some children; staff will endeavour to remove any anxiety that children may have around this.
